Discuss:

- Who invited you to church? Who invited you to this group? How did that make you feel?
- Which of the following events would you be most likely to invite someone to?
 - 47% of non-Christian people said if a neighbor invited them to an event to help make your neighborhood safer, they'd go.
 - o 43% would say yes to a Community service project
 - o 36% would say yes to a Sports or exercise program
 - 29% would say yes to a Worship Service
 - 20% would say yes to a Small group

- Matthew 9:12-13, "On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."
- Matthew 22:37-40, "Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart
 and with all your soul and with all your mind. This the first and greatest
 commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the
 Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."
- Matthew 25:35-40, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?" The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."
