OPENING QUESTION:

Have you been consistent this week in the area you committed to last week? Why or why not?

GROUPS VIDEO GUIDE

READ:

[Acts 9:1-19](#)

DISCUSS:

- Think back to your childhood. If you heard a parent or teacher say, “You are so irresponsible,” what were they likely referring to?
- What are some cultural trends that make personal accountability more challenging?
- After reading the story of Saul’s conversion in Acts chapter 9, in what ways do you see Saul taking responsibility for his actions?
- How do you differentiate between what you can control and what you must leave in God’s hands?
- How can community and accountability support our personal responsibility? How can this group support and challenge each other to live out our faith responsibly?

PRAYER:

Ask the group for specific areas where we need to take responsibility. Then ask God to give you self-control in each of those areas.

SCRIPTURES:
