Discuss:

- Share a time when you didn't ask for help that you really should have...when you were much younger and less mature, of course. [5 min]
- We see the triage in others when they don't ask for help. What area of life do you wish someone close to you would ask for help? finances, relationships, directions, decisions, time management, repairs, etc. [5 min]
- Read <u>Exodus 18:1-27</u>. Brainstorm a list of principles and practices you could share with a friend who needs to ask for help more. [10 min]
- If someone else were to need help in a specific area of life where you could really offer them help? What would that area be? [5 min]

Challenge:

Identify one area where you should probably ask for help and one person you think would be safe to ask. [5 min]

Scriptures:

- John 14:13-14 (ESV) "Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask me anything in my name, I will do it."
- Matthew 7:7 (ESV) "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you."

- James 1:5 (NIV) "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."
- Matthew 15:22, 25 (ESV) "And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon."... The woman came and knelt before him. "Lord, help me!" she said.
