CCV Groups Discussion Guide

OPENING QUESTION:

Share a time you were really nervous or vulnerable because you found yourself in a place or with people you didn't immediately belong.

GROUPS VIDEO GUIDE

READ:

Jonah 3: 1-10

DISCUSS:

- Like Jonah and the king, share a time when someone didn't meet your expectations. You expected them to respond in a negative way, but they surprised you and responded with humility, kindness or repentance.
- Describe a time when God gave you a second chance.
- How does the story of Nineveh help us understand the balance between God's judgment and His compassion?
- Does someone around you need a second chance? What can you do to offer that?

PRAYER:

Share the name of someone you know who needs a second chance. Pray for them by name.

SCRIPTURES:

Isaiah 6:8, "And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' Then I said, 'Here I am! Send me.'"

Matthew 28:19–20, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Mark 16:15, "And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation."

Psalm 96:3, "Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples!"

Romans 1:16, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek."

2 Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,"

Galatians 6:9, "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up."
