Opening Question:

Malachi 3:6-18

Discuss:

- When people are burdened with financial hardship or the economy takes a downturn, what are some common first reactions people have?
- Who or what has been most helpful for you in your own financial journey?
- Read <u>1 Corinthians 8:1-15</u>? What principles of giving can you draw from this passage?
- Do we all know about https://ccv.church/stewardship. It breaks down the resources into five categories: Surviving, Struggling, Stable, Secure, Surplus. Where would you say you are and why?
- The Stewardship page also highlights 3 areas of Stewardship: Discovery,
 Obedience, and Generosity. People will typically fall into 3 categories: tipping,
 tithing, and eventually generosity. Share your journey in these areas and where do you think most people struggle?
