- Read <u>Luke 14:12-14</u> and discuss why Jesus challenged his host to invite people
  who couldn't reciprocate the favor of a meal. How does Jesus' comment to the
  host in verse 13 compare to who Jesus invited to follow him?
- What would it look like or mean for your table to become a place of grace?
- Who is a person God put on your heart to invite to your table and share a meal with?
