OPENING QUESTION:

• What has been your biggest takeaway on Heaven or Hell from this series?

GROUPS VIDEO GUIDE

READ IT AGAIN:

• Revelation 21:1-5

DISCUSS:

- Was there a question about heaven or hell that was not answered for you in this series?
- Do you think most people you know think about death a lot, a little, too much, not enough? Why?
- Read Colossians 3:1–14 with this question in mind: What do I need to do now to prepare for life after death? Paul is specific here. You be specific too. Pick apart the list of things to put off and put on.
- If you knew the world would end in 30 days. What would you do differently between now and then?

PRAYER:

Pray the Matthew 6:10 prayer that God's kingdom would come. Tell God how you would like to participate in answering that prayer and ask for his help to accomplish it.

SCRIPTURES:

- **Colossians 3:3–4**, "For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory."
- Matthew 10:28, "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell."
- John 14:2, "In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?"

- Luke 23:43, And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise."
- **2** Corinthians 5:8, "Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord."
- Philippians 3:20–21, "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself."
- Revelation 21:4, "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."
- John 11:25, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live."
- Luke 16:19–31, "There was a rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate was laid a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table. Moreover, even the dogs came and licked his sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's side.
